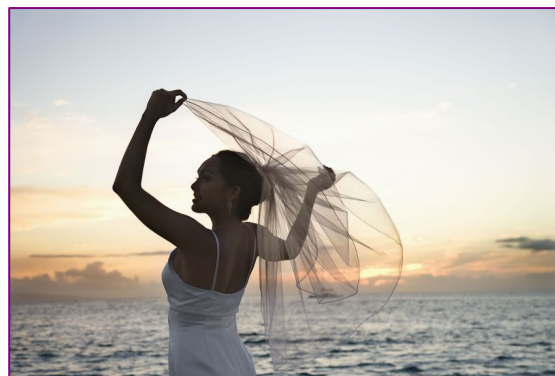

Things to consider
